<p>Unlike most Christian religions, many Eastern Orthodox churches in the United States celebrate Christmas on January 7th rather than December 25th. Christians are approximately 77% of the U.S. population. Should the Post Office suspend mail service across the U.S. on January 7th, December 25th, or both days?</p>		
<p>Seventh Day Adventists celebrate the Sabbath on Saturdays. In Loma Linda, California, they make up half of the population. Should the Post Office suspend mail service on Saturdays in Loma Linda?</p>		
<p>A Day of Thanksgiving was often, but not always, proclaimed by early presidents. Thanksgiving was made a national holiday by President Abraham Lincoln in 1863. Should the Post Office suspend mail service across the U.S. on Thanksgiving?</p>		
<p>Adherents to Judaism celebrate holy days such as Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement). Judaism is the religion of approximately 1.5% of the U.S. population, yet some areas of the country contain a large Jewish population. Should the Post Office suspend mail service on Jewish holidays where there is a large Jewish population?</p>		
<p>The Holy Month of Ramadan is a time when Muslims fast during daylight hours to celebrate the revelation of the first verses of the Qu'ran, the holy Book of Islam. California, New York, Illinois, New Jersey, Indiana, Michigan, Virginia, Texas, Ohio, and Maryland are states with significant Muslim populations. Should the Post Office reduce mail service in these states during Ramadan?</p>
